

Sophomores, Greetings from the College Office!

In this, your Class III year, we will not intrude much at all, but there are a few pieces of information related to standardized testing that we need to share with you.

- A number of you will be taking one, two, or even three SAT Subject Tests at the end of this academic year on either May 1 or June 5. FYI: The registration deadlines are March 31 for the May 1 test and May 5 for the June 5 test. (Milton Academy is a test site for both test dates.)
- How do you register for these tests? Good question! We recommend that you register online at www.collegeboard.com. If you set up an account for yourself with the College Board now, you will save lots of time in the future. Put your password in a safe place where you won't lose it or forget it!
- Which tests should you take? Yet another good question! In the past, some Class III students have taken SAT Subject Tests in:
 - * Math (check with your teacher)
 - * Foreign Language (if you have reached the 4th level, and especially if you are dropping the course after the 4th level)
 - * Physics or Chemistry (check with your teacher)
 - * Modern World History (check with your teacher)

- Before you take any of these tests, we recommend that you take at least one practice test. Practice books are available at your local bookstore. The College Board website also has sample questions for every Subject Test available at <http://sat.collegeboard.com/practice/sat-subject-test-preparation>.
- You don't necessarily need to know exactly which tests you want to take to register now. You can make that decision on the day of the test, if necessary. What is most important is that you register now, so that you have reserved a test booklet and seat for yourself at the test site.
