1. Return the completed application form with a \$50 (\$100 USD for international applicants) nonrefundable application fee by January 15, 2010.	_____

• <b>School Report and Release Form:</b> Sign and deliver to the principal or head of your child's current school. Due date: January 15, 2010.	_____
• <b>English Recommendation:</b> Deliver to your child's current teacher. The teacher should use the provided self-addressed envelope for direct return to the K-8 Office of Admission by January 15, 2010.	_____
• <b>Mathematics Recommendation:</b> Deliver to your child's current teacher. The teacher should use the provided self-addressed envelope for direct return to the K-8 Office of Admission by January 15, 2010.	_____
• <b>Parent Statement:</b> Complete and return by January 15, 2010.	_____
• <b>Applicant Statement:</b> Complete and return by January 15, 2010.	_____
3. <b>ISEE or SSAT:</b> Applicants for Grades 6-8 are required to submit results of either the Independent School Entrance Exam (ISEE) or the lower level of the Secondary School Admission Test (SSAT). Applicants should register for and take one of these tests by December 2009, and scores should be sent directly to Milton Academy. The ISEE school code for Milton Academy is 221430 and the SSAT school code for Milton Academy is 5098. For applicants for whom English is not the first language, the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) is strongly recommended.	_____
4. <b>Group Visits:</b> All applicants for Grade 6 will be scheduled for a group visit. These visits typically occur in January.	_____
5. <b>Individual Interview and Campus Tour:</b> If you have not already scheduled an interview and campus tour, please do so by contacting the K-8 Office of Admission at 617-898-2509.	_____
6. Complete financial aid forms (sent to all families who request the information on the application form) by January 15. *	_____
7. All completed admission materials must be received by January 15.	_____
8. Notification of the admission decision will be sent to all families on March 10, 2010. A family whose child has been offered an acceptance must return a signed enrollment contract with a deposit before April 10, 2010, to reserve a place for their child.	_____
9. Please tell us of any special needs your family may have. As always, we remain flexible for particular circumstances.	_____

\*Parents must complete and submit the Parents' Financial Statement (PFS) to the School and Student Service for Financial Aid (SSS) by January 15, 2010. The school code for Milton Academy is 5098. ## Paying for a Milton Education

We understand that choosing an independent education is a significant financial consideration. Milton Academy is deeply committed to enrolling outstanding applicants regardless of their families' financial circumstances. Although families must reapply for financial aid each year, a family should expect that grants will be renewed near the original level of funding unless a significant change in demonstrated need occurs.

For families that do not qualify for a need-based grant but would still like some flexibility in meeting tuition costs, Milton offers a 10-month payment plan as well as an extended repayment plan that allows families to spread payments over as many as eight years.
